ORDER OF ST PAUL THE FIRST HERMIT

The Pauline Order, founded in 1215, embraces the vocations of the priesthood and brotherhood.

Both Priests and Brothers wear the same habit, profess the same vows, and share together in the rich liturgical and devotional life of the Monastery.

The Habit, which is received at the beginning of the Novitiate, consists of a white tunic, scapular cowl, and rosary worn on the left side.

Candidates for the Priesthood make a one year Novitiate. They then pursue a Bachelor of Arts degree at a seminary approved by the Order with a major in Philosophy. Four years of Theological study are then made, followed by ordination.

Those wishing to serve the Order as a Brother also make a six month Postulancy which is followed by a two year Novitiate. Brothers may attend college after their novitiate if they are so inclined.

The Order of St. Paul the First Hermit offers men an excellent opportunity to serve their God and His Blessed Mother in a variety of ways. Our main apostolate is shrine work but we also have a retreat house and we have a number of parishes. It is a privilege to belong to the order which has for centuries promoted devotion to the Mother of God.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR ADMISSION

A candidate to the Order of St. Paul the First Hermit should have:

- · A desire to serve God more intimately.
- A deep devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary.
- · A good moral character.
- Sufficient good health.
- Several meetings with the Order's Vocation Director.
- A visit to the Monastery Come & See!

DOCUMENTS NEEDED

- · Baptismal and Confirmation certificates.
- Recent medical report (including blood tests).
- · Psychological testing results.
- School transcripts.
- · Three character references.
- · A copy of parents' marriage certificate.
- Recommendation of pastor or other priest.
- · Two recent photographs.

O.S.P.P.E

The Pauline Order is a community in which monastic priests and brothers realize their vocation through prayer, penance, preaching the Word of God and administering the Holy Sacraments, and by undertaking voluntary poverty, obedience and chastity. This order was founded by hermits in Hungary in the XIII century. When the first monks began their

communal life they chose as their patron St. Paul, the First Hermit from Thebes (230-343).Pauline Order was first brought Poland in 1382 to cherish and safeguard the Miraculous Painting of Our Lady placed at Jasna Gora in Czestochowa by Count Wladyslaw Opolczyk. thereafter, the monks in white habits were

entrusted with other churches, which often became recognized as Marian Shrines. During their long and rich history, the Paulines became known as the faithful sons of the Holy Church and great venerators of Our Lady.

The first monastery in the United States was founded in 1955 when a small farmhouse was purchased in Doylestown PA. The farmhouse was converted into a monastery and the barn into a chapel. In 1966, a large new Shrine to Our Lady of Czestochowa was dedicated.
