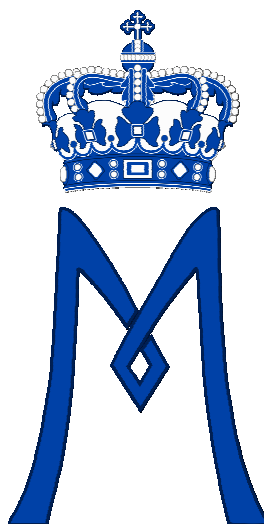
Consider This

February 11 - we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes.

Our Lady of Lourdes is a title for Jesus' mother that originated in the French Pyrenees in the mid-1800's. Catholic tradition relates that a frail, fourteen-year-old girl named Bernadette Soubirous had gone to gather firewood near a rocky outcropping outside

the town of Lourdes, an area used by the townsfolk as a trash dump. In the middle of this disregarded and ignored area, Mary appeared to Bernadette and opened up for her a spring of healing water.

This grotto, once entirely overlooked, is now a place of pilgrimage for thousands of the faithful seeking healing, comfort, and a place to draw near to God's goodness.

This feast day reminds us of a pattern that we can see throughout our religious heritage: a pattern of divine goodness being made known in
