Polish Easter Baskets for Blessing

Easter Bread – the Eucharist is the true bread of everlasting life.

Butter- Maslo: Should be shaped in the figure of a lamb or cross.

Candle Swieca: the only non-edible item. The Candle symbolizes Jesus, the Light of the World.

Colored Eggs – Pisanki: Indicate hope, new life and Resurrection.

Wine: symbolic of great joy and abundance.

Horseradish: represents the bitter herbs prescribed for the original Passover

Salt: preservation from corruption

The Seven Church Pilgrimage of Holy Thursday

Holy Thursday's pilgrimage of Seven Churches is rooted in a desire to follow Jesus from his arrest, through court trials, and finally to prison. This prayer expresses our desire to suffer with Christ and not abandon Him as did His disciples, even after He asked them *to pray that you may not fall into temptation* (Luke 22:30). Moving from place to place, you follow Jesus' nocturnal journey from Annas, to the high priest Caiaphas for an illegal night trial, Herod, and jail.

First Church: *Jesus' Agony in the Garden of Olives (Mark 14:32-38)*. Then they came to a place named Gethsemane, and he said to his disciples, “Sit here while I pray.” He took with him Peter, James, and John, and began to be troubled and distressed. Then he said to them, “My soul is sorrowful even unto death. Remain here and keep watch. He advanced a little and fell to the ground and prayed that if it were possible the hour might pass by him; he said, “Abba, Father,” all things are possible to you. Take this cup away from me, but not what I will but what you will.” When he returned he found them asleep. He said to Peter, “Simon, are you asleep?”
